2016-17 has been a year of many successes worth celebrating! The annual report, which follows, highlights some of those very important milestones, while also highlighting many of the individuals who are leading the way for our Foundation.

Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides is a national charity that relies entirely on donations. Strong support from our donors enables us to reach higher and higher each year with an ever-increasing number of our Dog Guides being placed with Canadians who are living with a medical or physical disability. This past year, we saw a record number of clients graduate from our facility – 182 in total – which puts us even closer to our goal of facilitating 200 of these partnerships each year! The increase in these services was made possible due to a successful breeding year that included the birth of over 300 future Dog Guide puppies. Each of those future Dog Guides are now on the path to becoming the next great working Dog Guides for Canadians in need.

Donations were substantial this year. Of notable significance was the record \$1.48 million raised through our Pet Valu Walk for Dog Guides. This national event continues to grow each year. Strong investment from our endowment funds, along with solid financial results, will allow our organization to advance and expand in the months and years ahead. We thank our many Lions clubs, as well as individual and corporate donors, for their very generous contributions.

Our dedicated Board of Directors, committed staff members, and our many hard-working volunteers deserve full compliments and high praise.

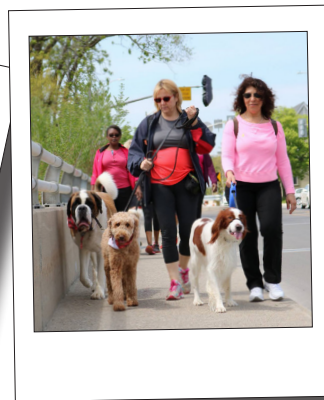


# Sharing our Successes

This was a year of many successes for Lions Foundation as we moved forward with our mission to provide Dog Guides at no cost to Canadians living with a medical or physical disability.

Lions Foundation recognizes the importance of growth and its positive impact when it comes to providing Dog Guides to Canadians who can benefit. This past year, many generous contributions made it possible for our programs to develop and expand. We saw 182 clients graduate, which was a remarkable increase. Thanks to financial growth, we are now closer than ever before to realizing our long-term goal of seeing 200 client graduates per year. While the number of individuals applying for a Dog Guide continues to grow, we remain committed to ensuring there are shorter waiting times for people to receive high-quality Dog Guides.

This year's annual report outlines the successes we had thanks to dedicated staff, volunteers and supporters who were instrumental in ensuring more partnerships than ever before were made possible.





# Path to Success

For someone with a disability, a Dog Guide is a priceless gift of independence. In reality, each Dog Guide costs approximately \$25,000 and takes almost two years to raise, train, and ultimately partner with its new handler. No one should be denied their independence. That's why Dog Guides – including all training, travel and accommodation for recipients – are provided at no cost.

## Successful Beginnings

Preparing future Dog Guide puppies for a successful career is something that begins before they are born. The Dog Guides Canada breeding program exhibits excellence and is consistently committed to high standards. Last year, 315 dogs entered Dog Guides' programs. Of those, 304 dogs came from Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides' own well-established breeding program. The remaining 11 were acquired through donations from generous select breeders or exchanges with other accredited service schools.

Each year, the number of puppies who qualify to become Dog Guides is remarkable. This year, the rate of dogs who successfully trained and qualified to work as Dog Guides climbed to an impressive 72 per cent. Lions Foundation remains focused on producing dogs that exhibit a high degree of trainability, intelligence, good health, and exceptional temperament. The Foundation is committed to ensuring its high standards by carefully screening potential breeding dogs, and selecting the very best for its breeding program. The breeds we use include Labrador retrievers, golden retrievers, Labrador cross golden retrievers, as well as standard and miniature poodles, which are bred to assist individuals with an allergy to dogs.

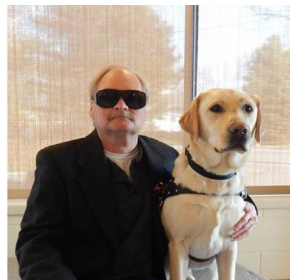
# Life-Changing Successes

The data reflects all facets of the Lions Foundation’s client experience, from the application process right to follow-up support. Categories are rated on a scale of one to 10, with 10 being the highest.



## Volunteers – Sharing Time & Expertise

Volunteers play an integral role in the success of the Foundation, as well as the training of our future Dog Guides. This year, volunteers have collaboratively dedicated over 5000 hours of their time to help with the training, grooming, walking, and cuddling of future Dog Guides, as well as organizing events and fundraisers, and assisting administrative staff with office tasks. They lend their time, expertise, and passion to help fulfill the Foundation's mission.

A large group of volunteers – our foster families – graciously opened their homes this year to provide 300+ future Dog Guide puppies with a loving place to stay. Foster families sign up for a 24/7 volunteer commitment and provide important opportunities to socialize Dog Guide puppies during the crucial first twelve months of life. After a year has passed, foster families bring the puppies back to Lions Foundation of Canada knowing that they have played an important role in shaping a life-changing Dog Guide.

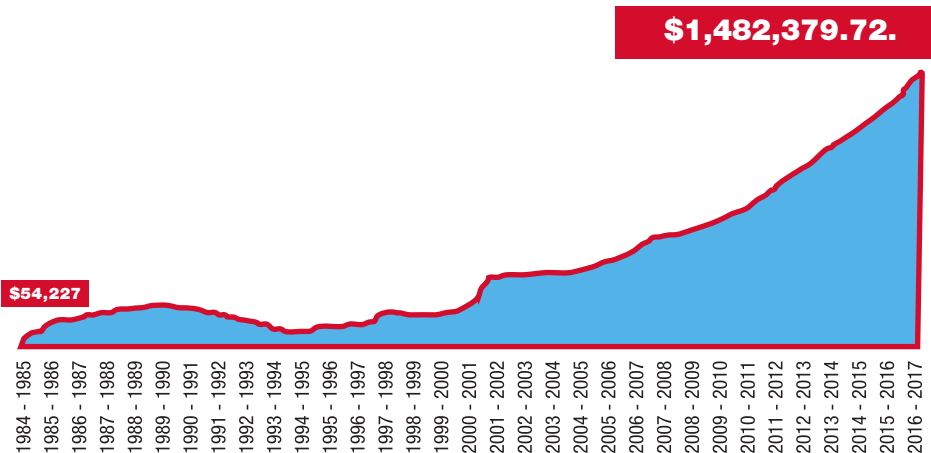

## Pet Valu Walk for Dog Guides

The Walk for Dog Guides started as a singular event back in 1985 and now takes place in every province across Canada. With a record number of communities participating in this year's Walk, a new fundraising record was set. Thanks to the dedication of Walk organizers, the participation of thousands of walkers, the support and generosity of donors, and our incredible sponsors, the total raised this year was \$1,482,379.72.





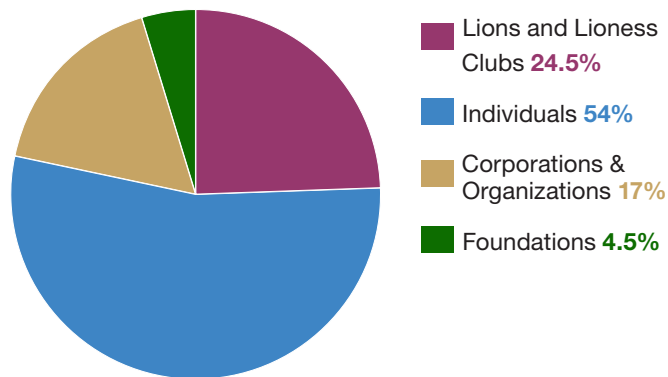


## Fundraising Success

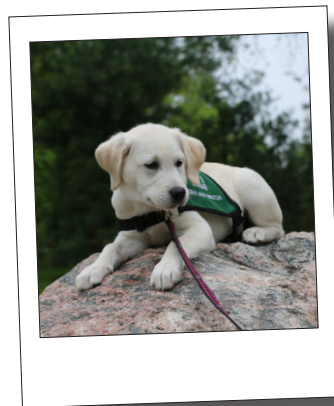
