An annual checkup at the Vet supports your Dog Guide's ability to work, ensuring they get their yearly vaccinations and maintain a healthy weight. When you visit the vet, please ask them to fill out a Dog Guides' Health Report

Did you know that we have digital Health Reports for each program in the <u>Life After</u> <u>Graduation</u> section of our website? Once completed, it can be sent to the program specific email address on the Health Report to keep us updated on the health of your dog. If you need a hard copy mailed to you or your Vet, please reach out to Client Services (<u>client-services@</u> <u>dogguides.com</u>). This report must be sent in at least once per year.

Halloween Safety Tips for Dog Guides

It's that spooky time of year again, and we have some tips on how your can keep your Dog Guide or future Dog Guide(s) safe on Howl-O-Ween.

1. Costumes - They should fit correctly and cause no harm. Don't put masks on dogs as they can reduce vision and may restrict breathing. and, paints, are pet safe and non-toxic. Do not leave dogs in their costumes unsupervised. Never force a dog to wear anything if they are uncomfortable.

2. Toxic Treats - Chocolate is always a concern around this time, and the darker the chocolate the more toxic it is to our dogs. Xylitol is also an ingredient to be aware of, as it is a sugar substitute that is more toxic per gram to dogs than any type of chocolate. It is a common ingredient in gum, peanut butter and chocolate (double the damage). Please be cautious and do not let your dogs have unwanted treats.

3. Dangerous Decorations - Pumpkins can be appealing to dogs. Moldy pumpkins can cause serious gastrointestinal disease and mess to your house if nibbled on. Fake cobwebs, spiders, candles and corncob decorations can also be dangerous;- if ingested they can cause intestinal blockage and likely surgery.

Note: Some costumes and decorations may be scary or overwhelming to some puppies and dogs. Watch the dogs for signs of stress and create distance from scary situations if necessary.
