## **AUTISM ASSISTANCE**

Autism Assistance Dog Guides assist children (ages 3-12) on the autism spectrum. These Dog Guides provide safety, companionship and unconditional love.



# SEIZURE RESPONSE

Seizure Response Dog Guides assist Canadians (10+ years) with epilepsy. These Dog Guides are trained to bark for help or activate an alert system in the event of a seizure.



# **DIABETIC ALERT**

Diabetic Alert Dog Guides assist Canadians (10+ years) who have diabetes with hypoglycemic unawareness. They are trained to detect sudden drops in their handler's blood sugar, and alert them.



# **FACILITY SUPPORT**
