Partnerships make us stronger and we cannot thank Pet Valu enough for their commitment and dedication as a pawtner in success!
















A Big Thank You to the Oakville McDonald's Locations!




Become a Day School Sitter to Help Dog Guides in training Graduate with Honours

We are looking for reliable sitters who can give the in-training dog a break from kennel. These volunteers would drop off the dogs to


