

Day School Program

School is in session and we need your help! While some of our dogs in training enjoy bunking with their friends, others do not enjoy the kennel environment. For some Dog Guides in training, it may be stressful living in the kennels, so much so that it may interfere with their training. If you live near the Oakville or Guelph facility, consider becoming a Day School volunteer.

"Some dogs in training are unphased by the kennel environment, where others thrive when they are able to continue living in a home for the duration of their training," says Gina Lijoi, Director of Programs and Client Services.



"Kennel stress is a real issue the entire industry faces - our Day School program has been the answer for us."















"Dogs that may have otherwise been unsuccessful are being matched with clients and going on to change lives as a result of Day School. That is why we are all here, and giving a dog a temporary home is a simple and wonderful way to ensure that happens."

Autism Assistance Dog in training Tarzan has benefited greatly from our Day School sitting program. After a day of hard work and learning, he enjoys going back to his sitter's house and spending evenings and weekends in a loving home. "Being a sitter has been a ton of fun for us. Our own dog now has a playmate, which happens to be his half-brother," says Gina.

Gina and her partner Emily have been sitting Tarzan only for a short while but his trainers have seen a big difference in him. Tarzan is now able to focus better and excel during his training sessions. He has settled down a lot as a result of being in a routine and having the comforts of a home.

"Tarzan is an incredible dog. He is attentive, sweet, incredibly affectionate, and very tuned-in. He will absolutely go on to change the life of a child, the life of a family, and will even have an impact on their community. The opportunity to help make this happen is like a gift."

Adopt a Career-Changed Dog


Interested in giving a dog a new home?
