Presenting the Dog Guides Scholarship Program

At Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides, our mission is to empower Canadians living with disabilities to navigate their world with confidence and independence, by providing a Dog Guide at no cost and supporting them in their journey together. We have been so fortunate to have your unwavering support throughout our journey, and for that, we are deeply grateful.

We are proud to announce the launch of our new Dog Guide Scholarship Program. The Dog Guide Scholarship Program helps to cover a portion of the \$35,000 that it takes to raise, train, and ultimately match a Dog Guide with its handler. The entire process takes up to two years and scholarships can help cover the cost for Dog Guides' training, veterinary care, as well as the transportation and accommodation for the handler while in residence at the Oakville training school. This support will help the Dog Guide team be partners for as long as 10 years, with a lifetime of follow-up. It's a gift that paves the way for a brighter future.

The Dog Guide Scholarship Program is part of our commitment to evolving and improving our services. **It replaces our existing sponsorship program, and we want to explain why.**

1. Our existing sponsorship program has not been updated since its inception to reflect increased operating costs.
2. At present, sponsorship levels are determined according to specific programs, ranging from \$4000 for a Hearing Dog Guide to \$12,000 for an Autism Assistance Dog Guide. Although the cost of training each Dog Guide, regardless of their program, remains consistent across all programs, this distinction in sponsorship levels has led to some confusion regarding the training costs associated with each program.
3. With the changes, our goal is to reduce wait times for assigning scholarships.

What if I am currently waiting for my sponsorship to be matched or have made a partial payment towards one?

1. All current sponsorships waiting to be matched or with a partial payment, will be recognized within the current sponsorship framework.
2. Donations received after October 23rd will be recognized under the Dog Guide Scholarship Program.

What does the Dog Guide Scholarship Program entail?

Learning is a lifelong process, and we are committed to providing our clients with a lifetime of follow-up support. By contributing to the Dog Guide Scholarship Program, you are giving the gift of education, and a future full of possibility. The opportunities to contribute towards a scholarship are:

- **Novice Scholarship - Early Training Unit \$5,000:** Providing basic skills and training for all Dog Guides
- **Intermediate Scholarship - Intro to training \$7,500:** Offering beginner program-specific training for dogs
- **Advanced Scholarship – Skills Training \$10,000:** Elevating skills to a high level with program-specific training for dogs
- **Expert Scholarship – Final team training \$15,000:** Enabling in-person training for clients with their Dog Guides at the LFCDG training school
- **Full Scholarship - Lifetime Partnership \$35,000:** Ensuring support and follow-up for the entire duration of the Dog Guide team’s working relationship. The Full Scholarship offers the only opportunity to name a Dog Guide (with LFCDG’s approval).

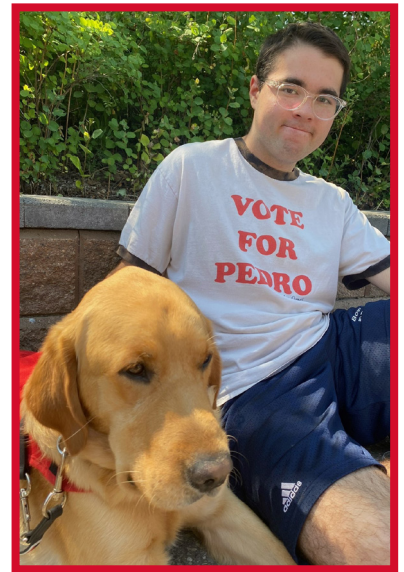
Client Corner

Jacob and Rocko's first meeting

Jacob and Rocko were sponsored by the Cochrane Lions Club

The day had finally arrived. Jacob and his mom Allison were both excited and anxious to meet the dog that would change their lives. They had planned to greet his father Jason with Autism Assistance Dog Guide Rocko at the airport when they first got off the plane. But things didn't go as planned. While they were walking through the airport, Jacob fell down unconscious and started to experience a seizure. Jacob was rushed to a nearby children's hospital and his father and Rocko followed behind. When Jacob regained consciousness, he was asked if he would like to meet Rocko.

"He hadn't been awake previously, so this was the first opportunity Jacob had to meet Rocko," Alison says, Jacob's mother. "Jacob called out Rocko's name and he came over and automatically gave him kisses. Jacob was weak and tired but was able to give him a little pat on the head and say 'good boy'; before falling back to sleep."



Over the next few days after being discharged, Jacob had to attend multiple assessments, tests, and doctor appointments. Jacob does not like the hospital and that is one of the things he struggles with, but Rocko had no problem coming and spending all day at the Children's Hospital to give Jacob all the support he needed.

"It was not the smooth, magical meeting we had planned, but we are grateful that Rocko was there to help Jacob get through this difficult time," says Alison. "Jacob has now been able to spend time swimming, playing and relaxing with his new best buddy Rocko. Their bond is growing, and we are enthusiastic about having this wonderful dog be the newest addition to our family."

Thank you Niagara Ice Dogs. We can't wait to be back for another game.

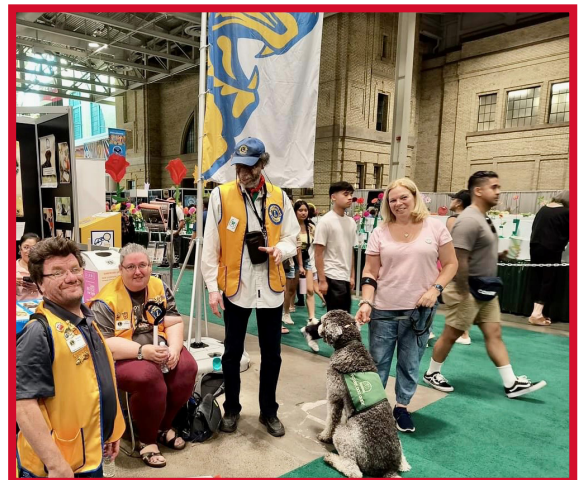


District A711 @ the CNE

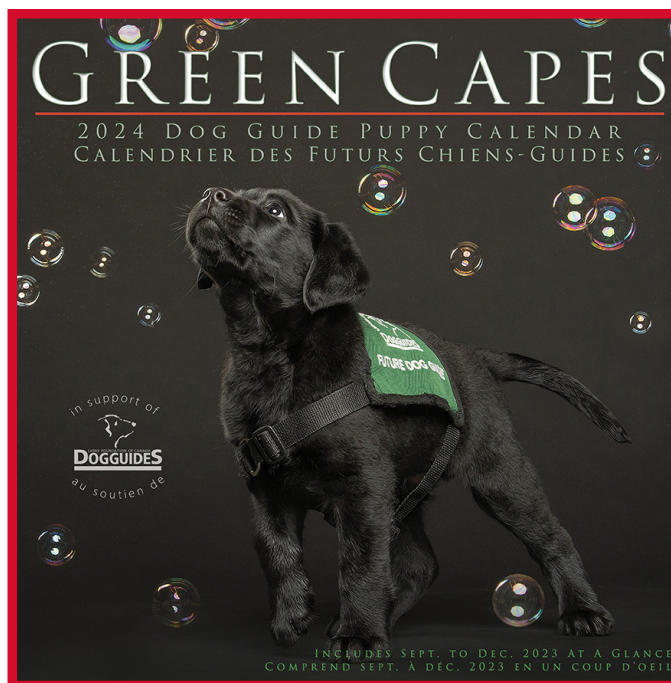
"The adorable puppies are hard to resist," Bev says,

"The calendars practically sell themselves!" Kensington Lions Club has used their club's proceeds to fund local scholarships and a dog sponsorship.

On the opposite end of the country in British Columbia, Gabriola Island Lions Club decided to give the calendar fundraiser a test run this year. Past Secretary Carol Martin and Lion Jude Briscoe ordered 50 calendars in June that sold quickly. *"It was so easy to sell them,"* Carol said, *"Our test run was a success!"* Now on their second order, the club sells the calendars at local events such as fall fairs and the Walk for Dog Guides. As the Co-LFC Chair for Vancouver Island, Carol enjoys spreading the word about Dog Guides and takes the opportunity to promote the calendar fundraiser to other clubs.

How does the fundraising partnership work? It's simple: your club sells the Green Capes Puppy Calendars for \$20 each, pays \$10 to Green Capes LC and keeps \$10 for your local activities. As a specialty Lions club dedicated to Dog Guides, Green Capes donates its proceeds to the school. It's a win-win for Lions!
