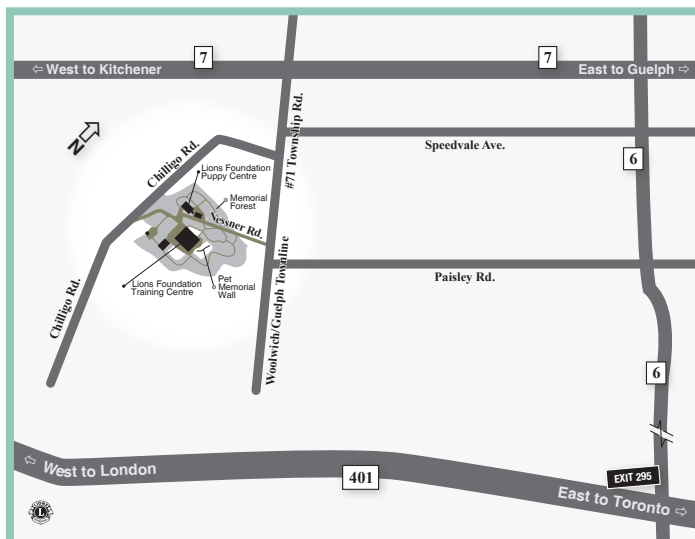

Dedicating a tree in the Memorial Forest is a unique way to celebrate the life of a loved one and honour their memory. As a symbol of strength, shelter and durability, a living tribute can be a source of comfort and meaning.

The Memorial Forest program was established in 1998 when Ron and Carolyn Brown planted the first tree in memory of Lion Stew O'Brien, PCC, a Charter Member of the Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides. Since that time, the Memorial Forest program has generated great interest among the Lions' family and Dog Guide supporters. As such, the forest will continue to flourish for future generations and assist funding Dog Guides to help change lives.

The Memorial Forest generates funds for the Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides seven programs: Canine Vision, Hearing, Service, Seizure Response, Autism Assistance, Diabetes Alert and Facility Support. Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides mission is to empower Canadians with disabilities to navigate their world with confidence and independence by providing Dog Guides at no cost to them and supporting each pair in their journey together.

Trees planted in the Memorial Forest are in memory of a Lion or friend of the Foundation. The name of the deceased is inscribed on a plaque and placed at the base of the tree. An in memoriam certificate, stating that a tree is planted in memory of the deceased, is sent to a designated family member or friend. Each year a dedication service is held at the Memorial Forest and a dedication service brochure is printed with the names of those for whom a tree has been planted in the preceding year.

To ensure the on-going maintenance of the Memorial Forest, Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides has established the Ballantyne Family Memorial Forest Endowment Fund with an initial substantial donation from the Ballantyne family of Elmira. Additional donations ensure funds are available for the continual care of the forest.
