

The Difference Campaign

In June 2024, LFCDG launched The Difference Campaign to the public, its most ambitious fundraising initiative ever, with the goal of raising \$50 million to construct a state-of-the-art national training school for Dog Guides and recipients.


With demand for Dog Guides steadily increasing, our current facility in Oakville—a retrofitted elementary school—no longer meets the growing needs of those we serve. The new national school will significantly enhance LFCDG's capacity, enabling us to increase the annual placement of Dog Guides from 150 to 250 over the next five years. The building will feature fully accessible training spaces and guest rooms for clients, improved kennel areas and play spaces to ensure the well-being of the dogs during their training and classrooms and training rooms for each program.

The Difference Campaign is more than just constructing a new building; it is an investment in the future potential of Canadians in need of a Dog Guide.

Thanks to the generosity of our incredible early supporters, the campaign has successfully raised \$40.5 million at our fiscal year end of June 30, 2024. These incredible donors are all listed at the end of this report.

As we move forward, our focus is on securing the remaining funds needed to bring this transformative Dog Guide school to life, making a lasting difference for people with disabilities for generations to come.


