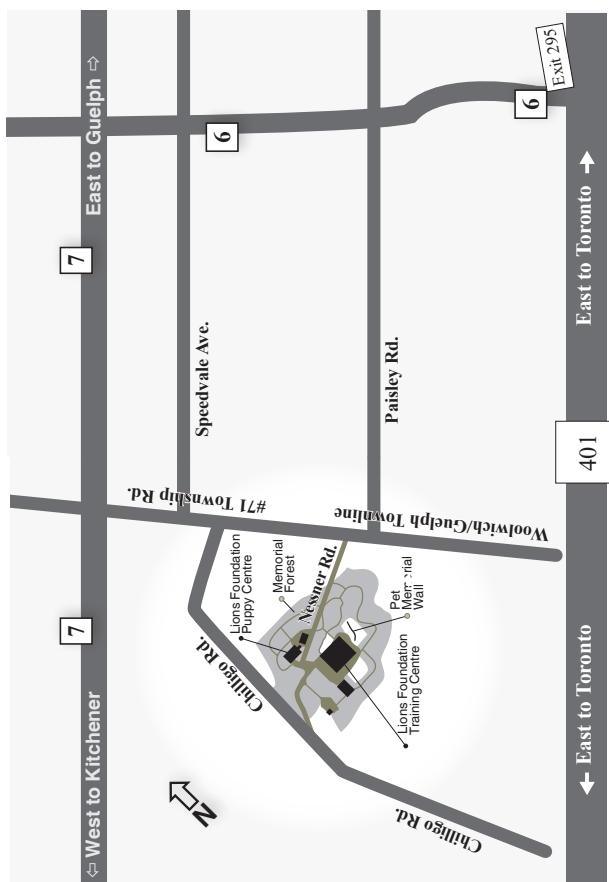
Visitors are welcome at the Memorial Forest at any time, however please call ahead to advise staff when you plan to arrive:
