The Difference Campaign

Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides can't wait to make more Dog Guide matches possible in the new national training school. One of the most important parts of creating more successful Dog Guides matches is, of course, the dogs! Providing future Dog Guides with comfortable and purpose-built living space is essential to their training. With 62 state-of-the-art kennels that will home 2 dogs together, there will be ample room for dogs to rest and live in the new school.


Each kennel is designed for optimal comfort, safety, and well-being for dogs in training. These kennels also open into some vital spaces; the play areas! Because future Dog Guides work hard, they need the time and space to play as well. Currently, LFCDG's training school is making use of one courtyard but it is not designed for dogs at play. Rocky footing and limited square footage pose challenges for play time.

In the new school, future Dog Guides will have custombuilt indoor play areas with specialty rubber footing to ensure comfort. With 7 separate indoor spaces connected to the kennels, LFCDG's dogs will have the spaces they need to relax, enjoy, and be prepared for training.

Reflecting on his visit, Jason shared:

Seeing firsthand how these highly trained Diabetic Alert Dogs can detect low blood sugar and provide life-saving support was truly incredible. He also highlighted the foundation's mission:




Making a Difference: Hunter & Yazar's Story




Celebrating Stephen Barker's Story in Niagara This Week
